Social Justice & Sports: A Journey Between Lines is a bold 5–15 minute short documentary that bridges the battlegrounds of the American South with global arenas—from Selma to Soweto, Georgia to Geneva—tracing the legacy of athletes who challenged injustice through the power of sport.

In the heat of the segregated South, sports became one of the few platforms where Black excellence could not be denied. From the raised fists of Tommie Smith and John Carlos to the quiet defiance of Black college teams in the Jim Crow era, the fight for justice was waged yard by yard. That same spirit echoes today in hijabi marathoners training at dawn in Saudi Arabia, in wheelchair racers surging across finish lines, and in queer Olympians walking proudly into stadiums under rainbow lights.

The film blends archival footage, scholar insight, and emotionally rich interviews with athletes across generations and continents. From rural high school fields in the Carolinas to Cape Town soccer pitches, from Cairo schoolyards to pride-lit stadiums in Berlin and Rio, *A Journey Between Lines* reveals the deep roots and far reach of resistance in sport.

Anchored by a filmed roundtable that unites athletes and thought leaders in a shared dialogue, the short film is both a historical meditation and a present-day manifesto. It connects the moral clarity of Southern civil rights struggles with today's global movements for inclusion, identity, and equality.

Because whether it's a protest on the podium, a team that refuses to be erased, or a girl lacing up her cleats for the first time—every act of courage leaves a mark. Every movement starts with a line drawn.
